

## ***GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS***

Students at Branson School Online are given a well-rounded education, including instruction in the areas of English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Foreign Language, Health/PE, Technology, and Elective options. Students at Branson School Online take six or seven courses each semester, including their four “core” courses (English, Math, Science, and Social Studies), and two or three additional courses. Courses at Branson School Online are each worth ½ credit per semester. Students earn six or seven credits per year and graduate when they meet all subject and area requirements, earn a total of 24 credits, complete an ICAP plan, and starting with the class of 2021, are able to meet or exceed one of the college and career readiness benchmarks. The tables below outline the required courses that are needed for students to receive a diploma from Branson School District RE-82.
